## Group of 6 people were allegedly physically and verbally assaulted in Adelaide

## **THURSDAY 18 JULY 2024**

The Islamophobia Register Australia (The Register) received an incident report overnight detailing an Islamophobic incident which allegedly occurred on 6 July 2024 in a hotel lobby in Adelaide.

The group of 6 friends, 3 of whom were Muslim and all of whom were wearing keffiyehs, were entering the hotel lift when the alleged perpetrator started physically and verbally abusing the group.

Aboud Shaweesh, one of the victims, recounted the incident to The Register: "This attack was unprovoked. He started by pushing me first, then yelling at us, saying, 'You f\*cking terrorist c\*nts'; 'You support these f\*cking terrorist Muslim c\*nts'; and 'I'll kill every one of you c\*nts'. He continued to punch us in the face and back until we finally were able to restrain him until the police arrived. He kept telling us that he wanted to kill us."

The incident reported to the Register comes amidst an unprecedented surge of over 580 per cent in Islamophobic incidents since October 7, 2023.

Executive Director, Dr. Nora Amath, stated: "What is deeply concerning is that these incidents are becoming increasingly violent. In the last two months alone, we have seen a number of Islamophobic threats referencing Christchurch terrorist Brenton Tarrant—once in Victoria and twice in New South Wales. This alarming trend underscores the urgent need for action."

The Register urgently calls for immediate and decisive action to address the rising tide of Islamophobia in the country. Any form of racism, whether Islamophobia or anti-semitism, is completely unacceptable.
